
## Alliance to address the EU challenges


## Challenge No. 1 – Innovation divide in the EU

- July 28th, 2017 Evaluation result: 15 points and the best project of the call




## Alliance4Life project in a nutshell

- Title: Alliance for Life Sciences
- Funding scheme: Horizon2020 / Health, demographic change and wellbeing
- Duration: 1.1.2018 –31.12.2020
- Budget: EUR 945 000
- Consortium: 10 institutions from 9 countries of EU-13
  - 7 Universities: Masaryk University CEITEC (Brno), Medical University of Łodz, School of Medicine – University of Zagreb, University of Tartu, Vilnius University – Faculty of Medicine, University of Ljubljana, Semmelweis University (Budapest)
  - 2 Research institutes: Biomedical centre SAV (Bratislava), Latvian Institute of Organic Synthesis (Riga)
  - 1 Research institute / Hospital: St. Anne's University Hospital Brno/International Clinical Research Center – FNUSA-ICRC (Brno)



### Alliance4Life aims

- First ever bottom-up action of EU-13 aimed at closing the health research and innovation divide through mutual learning, sharing practical experience and receiving feedback from high performing research institutions
- Ambition to serve as a role model for others

#### Effective administration and good governance


 Share good practice to achieve efficient and client-oriented administration and operations
